- > ~100 domestic sheep, 2 fields around Yuma
- > ~40 domestic goats, Vekol Valley/Maricopa Mtns
- ➤ 1 domestic goat on Saddle Mountain





Muggins Mountains/Red Bluff

- > 9/27 Initial report received: dead domestic sheep along canal; incident contained
- > 10/15 Second report received
 - o 53 dead domestic sheep in canal
 - Many more at large
 - o Received permission from owner to lethally remove
- > 10/20 thru 10/27 77 domestic sheep lethally removed
- > 3 bighorn sheep found in the vicinity also lethally removed
- > Nasal and tracheal swabs collected from bighorns and 20 domestic sheep

Resources expended

- ➤ Animals killed: 77 domestic sheep and 3 bighorn sheep
- ➤ Hours: 140 Department staff and 30 volunteer
- ➤ Miles driven: 1,172 Department and 200 volunteer
- > Cost: \$22,101.00


Laboratory results

- ➤ All of the domestic sheep had leukotoxin A positive bacteria
- ➤ 12 of 20 domestic sheep were positive for *M. ovipneumoniae*
- ➤ M. ovipneumoniae was very different from the strains found in bighorn sheep in the area



Muggins Mountains/Red Bluff -

Monitoring



➤ Captured and collared 17 bighorn sheep; collected samples

➤ Demonstrated movement from Red Bluff to surrounding ranges

Test results: 9 of 17 exposed to *M. ovipneumoniae*; pasteurella organisms detected in 1; *M. ovipneumoniae* detected in 4,



Vekol Valley

- > 12/17 Initial call received from BLM biologist, 11 goats observed by archery hunter
- > 12/18 Owner of goats identified, 30 to 40 animals had been "lost" about 30 d prior, assumed killed by predators
- > 12/19 Owner gave permission to lethally remove after unsuccessful attempt to capture
- > 12/20 to 12/21 removed 42 domestic goats in 3 groups, 2 groups were in bighorn sheep habitat; samples collected
- > No bighorn sheep were observed during removal



Vekol Valley

Resources expended:

➤ Animals killed: 42 domestic goats

➤ Hours: 87 Department staff

➤ Miles driven: 1,824 Department

> Cost: \$24,953.00

Testing results:

> 22 of 24 carrying *M. ovipneumoniae*

➤ Pasteurella organisms detected in 2 of 24





Saddle Mountain

- > 12/1 Single "white floppy eared goat" observed by bighorn sheep hunter
- Department personnel attempted to locate animal on foot and by helicopter, unsuccessful
- > Resources used:
 - 25 Staff hours
 - 230 miles in Department vehicles
 - Helicopter survey included in Vekol Valley total
