Dr. Cheryl Schultz is a professor of conservation biology at WSU, and has devoted her career to understanding the ecology of at-risk butterflies in response to key drivers such as habitat loss, climate change, and invasive species. Her work has helped to coordinate the recovery of endangered and threatened butterfly species and their prairie habitats in the Pacific Northwest. Currently, Dr. Schultz is on a sabbatical to serve as a Scholar in Residence at the USFWS Center for Pollinator Conservation, working to integrate available monitoring data to estimate the conservation status of butterflies in the United States.
