Our mission is to identify deserving college students from the Western States and Provinces and provide them access to WAFWA's Annual Summer Conference where they gain leadership skills through structured sessions and engage with fish and wildlife professionals inspiring them with the next steps of their careers.

Financial Support:

WAFWA hosted the first Student Engagement Program in 2024 consisting of 6 graduate and undergraduate students and was a smashing success. Many doors opened for both the students and agency partners as the program fostered meaningful connections. Our hope is to provide this opportunity to an even larger cohort in the future, but this cannot be accomplished without additional financial support. The current cost for a federal or NGO partner to sponsor this program is \$2500 which covers travel, lodging, and program delivery. In addition to interacting with students during the student mixer and WAFWA summer meeting sessions, sponsors will have the opportunity to host a student meal during the summer meeting.
